

Gabon's Jungle Beach

On the coast of Gabon, the rainforest of the Congo Basin meets the Atlantic Ocean. At this rare frontier, animals normally hidden deep in the jungle gather on the beach. Forest elephants, antelopes, monkeys and hippos – some even entering the surf – come in search of food, minerals, shelter, or relief from parasites. By night, the shoreline becomes a cradle of life, shaped by rhythms thousands of years old. But ocean currents now carry plastic waste to one of Africa's last untouched shores. This film explores this fragile ecosystem, where ancient natural cycles collide with modern threats.

SURFING HIPPOS is a cinematic journey into a unique ecosystem where forest and ocean meet, and ancient natural cycles collide with modern threats – a powerful portrait of a world on the edge, and a balance slowly slipping away.

A rapidly expanding border wall has been constructed on three out of every four miles in Arizona, New Mexico, and California, threatening to sever the potential for the jaguar's return to the United States and halt the flow of wildlife at a continental scale. Filmmakers Austin Alvarado, Ben Masters and local conservationists discover matriarch Libélula, a twelve-year-old Jaguar whose cubs could potentially migrate to the United States. For eight months they film Libélula, with the dream that her story can help stop further construction of a border wall and inspire increased conservation efforts in the shared ecosystem of the US-Mexico borderlands.

In a remote corner of Botswana, where the Okavango Delta dissolves into the baking sands of the Kalahari, water and desert are locked in a perpetual struggle. Dust follows that battle over the course of a year through flood and dust, abundance and starvation anchored by the longest terrestrial zebra migration in Africa and the animals whose lives hinge on the arrival of rain.

Dust blends big-screen spectacle with emotional, character-driven storytelling. It's a blue-chip, visually interesting natural history film with powerful, timely themes: climate, water, resilience, and the cost of survival in a rapidly changing world.

We witness a donkey giving birth, a rare and emotional moment for a species that now depends heavily on human care. Some animals arrive by choice: sparrows thrive near us, using buildings as nesting sites and benefiting from our constant supply of food.

LIFE IN THE OAK

A Stag Beetle Story

Oak trees, both dead and alive, are infinitely important to the stag beetle. Its larvae have been populating the fallen oak tree for decades. Wild boars, woodpeckers and jays are after the fat ground dwellers, which they can hear working on the old oak tree and thereby turning it into valuable humus over decades. A stag beetle larva spends 3-7 years in the ground before, usually after a thunderstorm, ending its secret life and leaving the ground as a majestic beetle. Only an intact mixed oak forest, such as the one on the Polish side of the Oder River, provides optimal living conditions for the stag beetles, which have become so rare.

They are in favour of fair trade, sustainability and against child labour. Critical consumers who browse the websites of chocolate manufacturers quickly feel good about their purchases. Chocolate, it seems, can be bought without a guilty conscience. But is that really true? A television crew travels to the Ivory Coast and uncovers appalling conditions: numerous children are toiling there under miserable conditions. The cocoa beans they harvest are also found in chocolate bars that bear a seal of sustainability and fair trade. The hunger for chocolate is a disaster not only for children, but also for nature. In order to plant more and more cocoa, the rainforest has to make way. Every year, enormous areas of forest are cleared to make room for the sweet, brown gold.

A gripping film about the bitter side of chocolate – most people's favourite sweet treat –, it reveals the bitter truth behind the sweet temptation and confronts viewers with the question of how much the enjoyment of chocolate is worth to us.




