As the burrowing owl population expands, he soon discovers there's more behind the story than first meets the eye. As he continues to make new discoveries about their behavior, a young family of burrowing owls face the challenges of growing up wild. This film tells an uplifting story about how animal conservation efforts can start small – with a single person – but if done right, can have an enormous positive impact on a species and it's habitat.

The film reveals the connections between boreal owls, yellow-necked mice, black woodpeckers and wood ants, showcasing how these nocturnal creatures adapt to increasingly shorter nights. While humans retreat from the eerie darkness, the forest comes alive. Unlike us, nocturnal animals thrive in the night, communicating through sounds, using ultrasound for navigation and having large eyes that help them get through the dense trees.

In a tropical jungle in Southeast Asia, this documentary unveils intimate portraits of exotic animals rarely seen on screen. We follow a growing Langur monkey, whose perception resembles ours, and meet characters like the majestic Asian elephant and the elusive Sun bear, along with intriguing Stick insects and Orb-weaver spiders. Featuring over 100 species, the film's meticulous style and music honour the forest's peaceful atmosphere, highlighting the importance of preserving the complex ecosystems of the Tenasserim mountains for future generations.



Hastily passing locals and tourists stop to watch the beautiful new urbanites on their adventures. Nowhere else can you get this close to the glittering starlings: In addition to their striking song, the songbirds are real beauties up close. The starlings of Alexanderplatz are becoming true city dwellers, while the population of this once ubiquitous bird is declining dramatically across Europe, they seem to have found a remarkable new home here in the centre of the metropolis – at least in winter.

South of Sicily lies the small Italian volcanic island of Linosa, home to one of the largest colonies of Scopoli's shearwaters in the Mediterranean region. The almost invisible birds were the creative spark behind one of the most renowned tales of Homer's epic poems Odyssey in which the eponymous hero Odysseus had himself tied to the mast of his ship, so he could safely listen to the sirens' songs which echoed far across the sea, intending to lure sailors to their doom. This documentary follows the Italian scientist Giacomo Dell'Omo. Since first working on Linosa in 2017, he has been visiting the island every year for several months, committed to protect the Scopoli's shearwater colony. Meanwhile, his daughter Eleonora now works by his side.




